And shout out to BCTF President Teri Mooring for sharing her perspectives as our guest speaker and taking so many questions from DTA members. Last week's DTA Annual General Meeting was the LONGEST in living memory! Clocking in at an impressive 4 hours and 15 minutes it was replete with run-off votes, drop-down elections, constitutional questions galore and more!

Many thanks to the amazing team here at the DTA office who helped put the meeting together and allowed it to run as smoothly as possible under the circumstances: 1st VP Alison Roche, 2nd VP Kathy Macfarlane and the DTA office staff (Marilyn, Debbie, Jane and Brianna). Special thanks to secondary teacher Toby Mundy (Seaquam) who accepted the challenge to serve as Nominating Chairperson through a grueling (long and tricky) set of elections.

We really appreciate the help we received from all. It was an exciting event and notably the BIGGEST turnout we have ever seen at a Delta AGM. WE HAD QUORUM!!!!! So great to have so many show up to participate and be part of the process. We know it's hard to come to yet another meeting but this is the one necessary to elect representatives, pass budget and fee motions, make constitutional changes and to receive reports from the table officers and EC members. The DTA is pleased to have passed a budget that allows for both the work of advocacy to continue and also offered no increase to the fee for the upcoming school year.

Please note: the DTA fee is a flat fee that DOES NOT automatically rise as a percentage fee would when members receive a pay increase. As costs rise, the DTA fee is adjusted from time to time to be able to cover the many services to members.

All EC spots were filled at the AGM except for one—the French as First or Working Language Representative.

Members have elected an EC of 18 and many committee members. The AGM also passed an important constitutional change to add a BIPOC Member at Large position on the EC. All constitutional changes take

effect for the 2021-2022 school year. All in all, the AGM was a stellar night!

I am honoured to continue my work as President on behalf of DTA members. This work is about relationships, asking hard questions, advising and seeking solutions for members—some in crisis in their lives—be it health or workplace concerns. I'm happy to continue in this challenging role with the amazing team of Alison Roche, Kathy Macfarlane, the wonderful new and returning EC members and staff reps, and of course all DTA members.
