Spring break is long gone but I wanted to thank the 14 DTA members who gave up 4 days of their break to attend the BCTF Annual General Meeting. Please see the list of new and returning BCTF Executive Committee members and Full Time

Table Officers. This was the first in-person BCTF AGM since 2019! Needless to say, everyone was pretty excited to get together. The DTA delegation was lively and thoughtful in debating the issues. (We also received a couple of reminders to quiet down, which speaks to how lively we were!!)

Passed this year was the fee for members which for next year will be 1.69%, unchanged from this year's fee. Note that the BCTF fee for the following year is always set at the BCTF AGM. There were several attempts to lower that fee, but the meeting decided to maintain the fee to allow for enhancing the Collective Bargaining Defence Fund and the Public Education Defence Fund. There were also attempts to raise the fees for Teachers Teaching On Call to 1.69% but this was defeated and TTOCs fees are set at 1.59% for the upcoming school year.

An important change to the makeup of the BCTF Executive Committee for the upcoming year is the addition of a Memberat-Large position designated for a 2SLGBTQ+ member. Here is the new language in the Standing Rules of order to address this change:

That Annual General Meeting Standing Rule 13.3 be amended as follows:

That the election be conducted in the following order:

- a. President
- b. First Vice-President
- c. Second Vice-President
- d. Member-at-Large designated for an Aboriginal member
- e. Member-at-Large designated for a member of colour
- f. Member-at-Large designated for a 2SLGBTQ+ member
- g. Members-at-Large.

District Budget Process

The DTA met with the District prior to Spring Break to hear projections for next year's budget which will be voted on by the Board of Trustees later in April. The DTA gave a submission to the

April 4th School Board meeting with suggestions to the Trustees for them to consider carefully their decisions regarding the upcoming budget. The impacts of the past few years of the pandemic coupled with chronic underfunding of BC's public education means the decisions of the Board will impact the future for teachers, students, and the community.

One foundational support in Delta right now is the District's Peer Support Program, now in its second year. Teachers from elementary to secondary have been supported by the powerful teamwork of the two District Peer Support Coordinators, Dana MacDonald and Fiona Fraser. The DTA has seen how this team has been so caring and responsive, supporting the needs of educators who have taken on new teaching assignments or who have had other needs in the vital work they do.

The DTA has seen the wisdom of creating this two-person team to support the larger team of educators in Delta. The DTA's message to trustees included a plug for the Peer Support Program to continue in its current format with two Delta teachers providing support. Additionally, the DTA urged those budgetary decisions favour keeping more of the team—such as the dedicated education assistants, the child and youth care workers and the so many others who help to build that supportive scaffolding for the students in Delta—in place for next year. The Board will share the proposed budget and then the public will have opportunity to respond at the April 18th (next Tuesday) School Board Meeting. The DTA will be there with a response. How about you?

As the District has now publicly announced its draft budget, one of the savings the District is proposing is a change in Library unallocated flexible time to provide for prep time for teachers. In other words, that additional ten minutes that elementary teachers are getting for prep time is largely going to be provided by teacher librarians. The DTA contends that this is an erosion of the valuable services provided by teacher librarians and find this change unacceptable. We will be discussing this proposed change with our union colleagues from the BCTF at our upcoming BCTF Metro Fraser Valley Zone Meeting this weekend.

Thinking of Retiring?



Excuse the impertinence of the question but did you know that letting the Delta School District know early helps determine the lay off line? There's no advantage to you letting the

District know at the end of June or in July or August. If you wait until the end of June or later to let the District (and the Teachers Pension Plan) know, you lose out on a pension payment for July and/or August. You need to give a minimum of 30 days notice to the District.

A question the DTA receives a lot: Where is the form for telling the district about retirement? In fact, there is no such form. You just need to send a letter or an email to Shannon Hunt (shunt@deltaschools.ca) letting her know your plan.
